PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Emergency Evacuation

Last week the school had to enact our emergency evacuation plan due to a gas leak in one of our buildings. All classes were evacuated to the school oval as per our plan and I was incredibly impressed with the calm and sensible manner in which all students handled the situation. Several emergency service vehicles attended our site and once the situation was deemed to be safe all classes returned to rooms to finish the day.

I would like to sincerely thank all staff for ensuring our students remained safe and calm throughout the evacuation - our children were certainly in safe hands!

2022 School Leaders

I would like to wish our Year 5 students who are presenting a speech for school leader all the best of luck. These students have had to meet specific criteria to be eligible and then present their speech to their peers. Speeches will be recorded and each class from Year 2 up will also be able to watch via Zoom and vote for who they would like to have represent them for 2022. Support Unit Plans

I'm pleased to announce that next year will see the establishment of a Support Unit here at Valley View PS with two additional MC classes (Multi-Categorical) to join our current MC class. These classes will come with another teacher, an Assistant Principal Special Education and two additional Student Learning Support Officers. This is an incredibly positive development for our school and one that will help to encourage inclusivity and support amongst our student population.

The recruitment process for the Assistant Principal Special Education position is underway and I look forward to announcing our new team member before the end of the year.

Semester 2 Reports

Teachers are currently finalising Semester 2 student reports which will be sent home with every child in Week 11. Requirements for reporting to parents K-6 have changes to support schools for Semester 2 2021 as a result of the impact of COVID-19. Student reports will provide a summative account of student progress and achievement on learning covered during Semester 2, at school and at a home. Special thanks must go to all of our teachers who are working diligently in writing end of year reports. As always, parents are encouraged to contact their child's teacher at any time to discuss their child's learning and wellbeing needs, progress and achievements.

Presentation Day

Our school Presentation Day will be held on Friday, 10th December and will be run in separate cohorts so we can ensure COVID safe practices are followed. Unfortunately, we will be unable to have parents attend so we will be sending photos of award winners home via Dojo, with a presentation made for our Facebook page.

The staff carpark driveway CANNOT be used as a turning bay as it is dangerous to do so, nor can parents park on the nature strip beside the driveways. TELL THEM FROM ME SURVEY

Students 4-6 are currently participating in the Tell Them from Me survey along with our teaching staff. The parent survey helps to clarify and strengthen the important relationship between parents and school. The survey is anonymous and is used to identify trends within schools and better inform school priorities. The survey is held once a year and is run at the same time as the teacher survey and the second student survey. The survey is available in multiple languages and is conducted entirely online on computers, tablets, iPad or smartphones during the specific survey window. The survey takes around 15 minutes to complete. Parents with more than one child at the school may choose to complete the survey more than once, if they feel that their children's experiences differ. Tell Them From Me student Survey:

Information for parents and consent form for parents and carers

Dear Parents and Carers

This term, our school is taking part in the Tell Them From Me student survey. The survey will provide us with valuable feedback on what our students think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. Schools in Australia and around the world have used the Tell Them From Me survey to help them improve. The survey is completed online and is run by an independent research company, **The Learning Bar** which specialises in school-based surveys.

Staff in schools will **not** be able to identify individual students from their responses. To ensure confidentiality, participating students will receive a unique username and password. Where fewer than five students respond to a question, the results will be suppressed. The survey typically takes 30 minutes or less to complete and will be administered by the school during normal school hours. Once the surveys are completed by students, reports are prepared and in most cases are available to schools within three business days.

This survey will help out school better understand how to improve student wellbeing and engagement. It will help the school identify what works to improve student outcomes.

Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary. Your child will not take part if either you or your child do not wish. If, during the survey, your child is uncomfortable, he/she can choose to stop the survey at any time. The majority of questions in the survey can be skipped.

ROAD SAFETY MESSAGE

Keep your child safe!

Your child is still developing an understanding of danger and safety around roads. While they are often keen to do things for themselves, an adult must always be responsible in a traffic environment.

Your child is a vulnerable road user. They are still developing the skills that help them to judge the direction of sound and the speed and distance of vehicles. Your child is physically small, making it harder for drivers to see them. They may be easily distracted and tend to only be able to focus on one thing at a time. This means that they find it difficult to deal with sudden changes in the traffic environment.

Your child may be able to tell you the rules and how to keep safe near in and around vehicles, but in reality, will not always be able to apply them.
