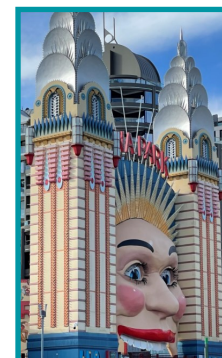

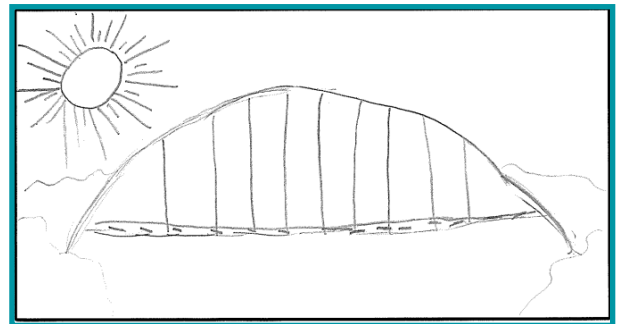
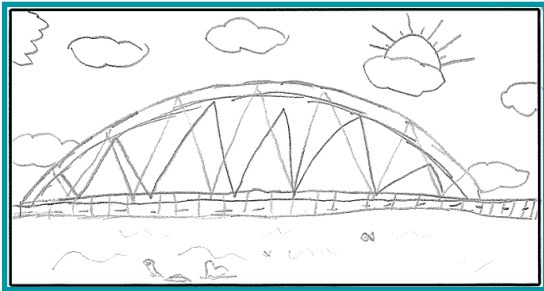
Students who have qualified to compete in the Brisbane Water Zone Athletics Carnival in August will be notified closer to the date.

## ONLINE ENROLMENTS

The Online Enrolment System is now up and running. This system is designed to provide flexibility for our parents to submit an enrolment application online and at the time that suits you best. The application can be accessed on all browsers and mobile devices including iOS and Android.

The online application process is currently restricted to:

- ◆ Enrolments into **local** schools only
- ◆ Children who are Australian citizens, New Zealand citizens or permanent residents
- ◆ Children who live in NSW.

We offer our support and encourage you to complete your application to enrol online. If, however, you do not feel comfortable completing an application online, a paper copy will be available for collection from the front office or can be downloaded from the Department's [going to a public school site](#).

## SCHOOL GATES

School gates are locked each morning at 9:30am and opened again in the afternoon at 2:30pm. If you have to come into the school **please phone the office for instructions 4328 4433**.

There is no entry during the day through the Binya or Elizabeth Street gates. Entry into the school will only be through the pedestrian gate next to the main driveway gate, **We ask that you close the gate as you enter and leave.**



## PAYMENTS TO SCHOOL

Parents are reminded that all payments made to school in cash **MUST** be sent to school in an envelope or plastic bag with your Child's name, class and what the payment is for clearly marked on the front.

Payments for any P&C run events or fundraisers cannot be paid on-line - we have no facility to pay it to the P&C.

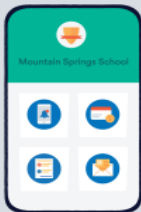
