PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Welcome Back

Welcome back everyone for Term 4. I've had the chance to listen to wonderful stories of your busy holidays since our return to school last week and it was lovely to hear school holidays getting back to 'normal; with lots of travel and family visits.

Term 4 is traditionally busy and this one is no exception with excursions, swim school, the Dental Van and end of year formalities all ahead of us. Please ensure that you read all outgoing communication and take note of dates and times for events, it's going to be a busy term!

Covid Guidelines Update

Change to isolation requirements in schools

On 30 September, National Cabinet announced that from Friday 14 October 2022 people who test positive to COVID-19 do not need to self-isolate. In line with this announcement, the following advice is based on recommendations from NSW Health and will support schools in adapting the change while minimising the risk of COVID-19 transmissions.

Students and staff should continue to stay home when sick

It is expected that now that isolation requirements have ended, those currently in isolation will be advised by NSW Health that they may exit isolation.

Students, staff and visitors should only attend school when symptom free. We strongly encourage all students, staff and visitors to follow the guidance issued by NSW HealthExternal link. Schools will continue to send home students or staff displaying symptoms.

Anyone who believes they have been exposed to COVID-19 is strongly recommended to monitor for symptoms and test if they have any concerns, as well as wear a mask. The department will continue to make rapid antigen tests (RATs) available for students and staff who need to test for COVID-19. RAT testing may help identify the infection early and is important if you are in contact with people at greater risk of serious illness if exposed to COVID-19.

Basketball Court

I am excited to announce that plans are underway for a joint funded project between our school and the Department of Education to build a full-size basketball court near the fixed equipment. This will give our students another play space and allow for multiple sports to be played. I look forward to showing you the final plans in the coming weeks.

School Development Days

A letter was sent out last week explaining the change to School Development Days at the end of the year. **The last day for students will be Friday, 16th of December** with both Monday and Tuesday now being set as School Development Days by the Department of Education to support the implementation of the new K-2 English and Mathematics syllabuses next year.

Year 6 Colour Run

The major Year 6 fundraiser this year will be an exciting Colour Run on the 28th of October! Permission notes have been sent out and it is extremely pleasing to see how many have already been returned. We can't wait to see the explosion of colour around our school!

2023 Planning

The school executive team and I are beginning our preparations for 2023 and we require accurate enrolment figures to determine how our school is staffed and the likely class structures for next year. If you are aware of any students moving into our area who will be attending our school in 2023 please ask the families to make contact with the school and commence the enrolment process. If you are moving out of the area in 2023, please let the front office know as soon as possible.



I am also asking that if you have any concerns regarding your child's class placement next year, please email the school. The executive staff and I are happy for parents to outline aspects of their child's learning and development that **may need special consideration** when forming class compositions for the following year, which may impact upon their academic, social or emotional wellbeing. However, please do not request specific teachers as we do not take these sorts of requests into consideration when composing class lists.

Headsets

Dear Parents,

Our students are fortunate to have access to a range of technology devices for instructional and assessment purposes.

This semester, the P&C Association have funded the purchase of headsets for every student so that they can access and create content using various forms of multimedia, including audio and video. These headsets will allow students to engage with their learning without the distraction of hearing each other's devices.

Headsets are labelled with each student's name and will be kept at school. They will follow students right through to the end of Year 6 at which point they can take them home to keep. Headsets will also be added to kindergarten book packs from 2023 so that they become a piece of standardised equipment for every student.

Headsets will be kept in classrooms and the onus of caring for their headsets falls upon the students. Replacements will not be given for damaged or lost headsets, however, may be bought from the school in the event of damage or loss. Students can bring in their own replacements if they choose, however the same onus of care applies.

We are extremely grateful to the P&C for this contribution and have already started using our new headsets in classes.


