Dogs On School Grounds

I would like to remind everyone that dogs are not permitted on school grounds. Under the Companion Animals Act 1998 (NSW), Section 14, dogs are prohibited on school grounds unless the Principal grants permission. Reasons why the Principal may grant permission for a dog to be in a school include: assistance/service dogs, visits by organised groups or school support dogs.

Selective High School - 2024

Selective high schools cater for academically gifted students with high potential who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic standard. Selective high schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability and by using specialised teaching methods.

Applications for selective high school placement are considered on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and no longer takes into account school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 4 May 2023.

Applications for Year 7 entry to selective high schools in 2024 are accepted from Tuesday 18 October 2022 to Wednesday 16 November 2022. You must apply before the closing date as no late applications will be considered. Please note, there are no paper application forms.
