PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

National Science Week

Last week was National Science Week, and to celebrate we had two very special events. On Wednesday our school participated in a whole school STEM day where all stages rotated around four different stations, learning about a wide variety of science based themes and completing activities such a sound, building rockets, lungs and paper gliders, and coding.

A big thank you to Mrs Tomlinson for organising the day and for her successful application of a grant to support the cost of the activities.

Then on Thursday Stage 2 were involved in a Science Week Planetarium Incursion. We had a visiting organisation come and blow up a huge indoor planetarium in the hall which all classes thoroughly enjoyed. Thanks once again to Mrs Tomlinson for organising.

Police Youth Liaison Visit

Last Thursday we had Senior Constable McCarthur visit us in his role as the Police Youth Liaison Officer. He presented a talk on safety to our Support Unit students and then a talk to Stage 3 about cyber safety and vaping. It was incredibly informative, and at times the information he presented was a little confronting, but it is extremely vital that our students are prepared and made aware of the dangers that lie in online gaming, messaging, and vaping. I encourage you to talk to your children and ask them about the talk open and honest conversations are the key to keeping our kids safe.



STEM DAY

On Wednesday the whole school participated in STEM Day, completing activities such as UV sensitive critters, designing foil boats and animal enclosures, coding directions to exit a maze and exploring sound waves.

It was fantastic to see all staff and students get involved and learn about many scientific, mathematical, engineering and technological concepts.

The activities were:

ES1: Making UV sensitive critters, paper helicopters, building a lego bridge and building 2D shapes.

S1: Foil boats, 2D shape art, designing an animal enclosure and designing a marble maze.

S2: Optical illusion spinners, Lego maze coding, toothpick tower challenge and hoop gliders.

S3: Model lungs, soundwaves, gummy bear growth and boat design and building.

Hopefully we inspired some budding scientists, engineers, and mathematicians. Congratulations to all for a productive and fun day.

CLean Up & STEM Day






