2024 Planning

Bushfire and Grassfire Risk Categories

The Health, Safety and Staff Wellbeing Directorate has worked with the NSW Rural Fire Service to align our Bushfire and Grassfire Risk Register with the new Australian Fire Danger Rating System. There are now four risk categories (up from three) ranging from Category 1 (extreme risk) to Category 4 (low risk).

Valley View Public School's Bushfire and Grassfire Risk Rating is Category 3. This means our school has been determined to have moderate landscape-to-site bushfire and grassfire risk. For this reason, our school may be directed to become non-operational ahead of a higher-risk day by the department on advice from emergency services or the State Emergency Operations Centre. Please be aware that other local schools may have a different category rating to us so the information that they pass onto community may differ, particularly in days that have been determined as a higher-risk day for those schools that have a risk category of 1 or 2.

Stage 3 Bathurst Excursion

In week 10 last term, 90 Stage 3 students set off to Bathurst for a three day adventure. We left Valley View Public School bright and early and set off to the Blue Mountains. We arrived at Echo Point to a windy but sunny day. After losing two hats to the strong wind and several photos with the Three Sisters, we had lunch and play and then it was back on the bus to go to Scenic World. Scenic world was a real highlight of the trip. We first took the Scenic Rail down to the lower levels of the Blue Mountains. We then did a 30 minute bush walk through the rainforest and the dinosaur experience to the cable car. After arriving back at the top, we travelled across the Blue Mountains on the Scenic Skyway. Many of the students commented that this had been 'The best day ever!'

After leaving the Blue Mountains we headed straight for Bathurst. We took at spin around Mount Panorama on the bus where the staff were busy painting the tracks and setting up the equipment ready for the upcoming races. Many students (and staff) were surprised to find out that people actually live on the track and that on any normal day, the track is actually an every day road (with extra police supervision to avoid every day becoming a

race day).

We arrived at our motel very tired and ready for dinner after such a big day, but it wasn't over yet! Dinner was followed by line dancing and the instructor complimented our Stage 3 students on their participation and good behaviour. Well done Stage 3.

Day 2 saw us travel to Hill End for some history and some gold panning. Unfortunately, this was a very windy road and not the favourite part of the day for some children or poor Mrs.
Turner, who was playing nurse at the back of the bus!

We started our morning at History Hill where we could explore the museum and an old mine shaft. After a sausage sizzle and a play we were then off to Hill End to explore the town and do some gold panning. Next time, we need to add gum boots to the list of things to bring! Our guide taught us a lot of interesting facts about the town and the historic buildings. He was very knowledgeable about gold panning and enjoyed sharing his success stories with us all. We explored a gully where it was explained how the gold settles before heading off to try the panning for ourselves. Many students were successful finding gold and Adrian found the largest fleck of gold for the day. After a long day, we headed back to our motel where we enjoyed some down time and some dinner béfore watching a movie and heading to bed for a well deserved sleep.

On Day 3, we explored life in colonial times at our accommodation. We were able to explore the museum and an imitation mine shaft before doing some more gold panning. Our guide demonstrated how to heat the fire for metal work and we were able to observe an old steam engine. After, we had the opportunity to make and try some damper, play some old time games and make mud bricks. It was a great day and we had a lot of fun.

After a long trip home, a very tired Stage 3 arrived back at Valley View Public School ahead of schedule. I am not sure about the children, but I know the teachers slept very well that night! Thank you for a great excursion Stage 3 and a special thank you to Mrs Squires and the teachers. We are looking forward to the next one!


















Sydney North



NSW Health Mobile Dental Program











NSW Health Primary School Dental Program

NSW Health is working with the Department of Education and public primary schools to offer free dental check-ups and preventive care, to all students as part of a school-based mobile dental program. Our school has been selected to participate the program.

Many parents may not realise two important things about their children's teeth:

- 1. Good oral health is essential for children to successfully learn and participate at school, and
- NSW Health offers free public dental health services to all children under 18 years of age.

Learning and behaviour difficulties at school can start with tooth and gum problems. That's because decay and gum disease can cause pain and difficulties in eating, sleeping, talking, concentrating, and learning, which can in turn affect a child's behaviour in class. A child with tooth decay may feel self-conscious about the way their teeth look and feel, making it harder for them to join in class and social activities.

Our school is participating in the program and offering students the opportunity to have free dental check-ups in a comfortable and familiar environment at school. With a parent/carers consent, students are able to have a free dental check-up and free preventive care.


The program is scheduled to visit our school from 6/11/2023 to 24/11/2023.

A Parent Information and Consent Pack will be sent home with each student, and includes information sheets, consent forms and the program privacy statement. Parents/carers who want their child to receive care are advised to:

- Read all the information provided in the pack
- Carefully complete all the fields of the consent forms
- Return the consent forms to the school as soon as possible


Referendum BBQ

School Student Travel

Term 4 2023

2024 school travel applications are now open

Students who need a new or replacement School Opal card or travel pass for 2024 can <u>apply</u> now. A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for the first time, or if they are requesting an additional travel entitlement because of a new shared parental arrangement (e.g. joint custody).

Students who change address, school, campus location, have repeated a year or received an expiry notification for their school travel entitlement should <u>renew or update</u> their details <u>before</u> the end of term 4. This will ensure that schools can endorse applications, and travel passes remain valid for the start of the 2024 school year. School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.

If a student's distance eligibility has changed based on their grade (i.e. grade two to grade three), the system will automatically update their entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, we will send an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition that is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their Student Opal card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2024.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the start of the new school year from their nominated transport operator. It may come via the school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Changes to your bus service provider

Within Greater Sydney, a number of bus service providers have changed their names.

Parents intending to lodge an application for a School Opal card will need to visit <u>transportnsw.info</u>
<u>trip planner</u> to obtain the correct bus operator name servicing your area prior to lodging an
application.

Travel from Term 12024

We ask that parents plan ahead and make sure their child knows which service/s to use and has a valid ticket to travel; either a School Opal card or Child/Youth Opal card (within Greater Sydney) or a School Travel Pass (outside Greater Sydney), from the start of the school year.

Applications for 2024 School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) travel open at the start of Term 4 2023, so parents/students can <u>apply</u> or <u>update</u> details early and be ready for the start of the new school year.

Most students using the Opal network will not need a new Opal card and can continue travelling on their existing card each year.

The start of the year is a busy period for local transport operators, and students travelling without a valid ticket make service planning and operations difficult.

We recognise that for some families last minute changes to school enrolments mean they may not have a School Opal card or Travel Pass for the start of term. In the Opal network, we strongly encourage these families to have their children travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their local bus operator to discuss their travel needs.

Bus operators are flexible and understanding, particularly at the start of the school year, and will ensure students can travel safely to and from school. But to best support our operators we encourage all students to have a valid ticket, as early as possible, from the start of the school year.

Students using School Opal cards are also reminded that they must tap on and tap off in line with the Student code of conduct and Opal terms of use.
