Kindergarten 2024

We are now taking enrolments for Kindergarten in 2024. If you have a child starting next year or have any friends or neighbours with children planning on starting next year, please contact the office to start the enrolment process. Alternatively, online enrolments can be completed via the following link: https://valleyview-p.schools.nsw.gov.au/about-our-school/enrolment.html

Children may be enrolled in Kindergarten at the beginning of the school year if they turn five years of age on or before 31 July in that year. By law, all children must be enrolled in school by their sixth birthday. As part of the enrolment process, you will need to provide your child's original birth certificate, statement of complete immunisation from Medicare and proof of your current address (a minimum of 100 points of identification are required).

2024 School Planning

We are currently in the process of planning for 2024 (hard to believe it's that time of the year already) therefore we are asking if you are aware that your children will not be attending our school in 2024, please contact the front office or send a note to your child's class teacher and let us know.

Alternatively, if you know of students moving into the area please ask their parents to contact us.

Over the school holidays, the classrooms in E Block (Stage 2 and 3 classrooms) will be getting a fresh coat of paint. They are hoping to get through a few rooms, however some classes may need to relocate temporarily when we return from school holidays while the painting is completed.

NSW Health Mobile Dental Program











NSW Health Primary School Dental Program

NSW Health is working with the Department of Education and public primary schools to offer free dental check-ups and preventive care, to all students as part of a school-based mobile dental program. Our school has been selected to participate the program.

Many parents may not realise two important things about their children's teeth:

- 1. Good oral health is essential for children to successfully learn and participate at school, and
- NSW Health offers free public dental health services to all children under 18 years of age.

Learning and behaviour difficulties at school can start with tooth and gum problems. That's because decay and gum disease can cause pain and difficulties in eating, sleeping, talking, concentrating, and learning, which can in turn affect a child's behaviour in class. A child with tooth decay may feel self-conscious about the way their teeth look and feel, making it harder for them to join in class and social activities.

Our school is participating in the program and offering students the opportunity to have free dental check-ups in a comfortable and familiar environment at school. With a parent/carers consent, students are able to have a free dental check-up and free preventive care.


The program is scheduled to visit our school from 6/11/2023 to 24/11/2023.

A Parent Information and Consent Pack will be sent home with each student, and includes information sheets, consent forms and the program privacy statement. Parents/carers who want their child to receive care are advised to:

- Read all the information provided in the pack
- Carefully complete all the fields of the consent forms
- Return the consent forms to the school as soon as possible


