Respectful communication is a right

In all workplaces people have the right to feel respected. Unacceptable and offensive behaviour has no place in our school communities.

To ensure the wellbeing of students, staff and the community in our schools, steps will be taken to address unacceptable behaviour. This may include restricting contact with the school community or, in more serious cases, referral to NSW Police.

Unacceptable behaviour may include but is not limited to:

- · Aggressive or intimidating actions, such as violence, threatening gestures or physical proximity.
- Aggressive or intimidating language, including the use of obscenities, making sexist, racist or derogatory comments or using a rude tone.
- · Treating members of the school community differently due to aspects such as their religion or disability.
- Inappropriate and time wasting communication.

WORKING TOGETHER FOR STUDENT ATTENDANCE AND TO MAXIMISE LEARNING

Dear parents and carers,

We want to do all we can to be sure your child achieves their potential and enjoys being in school.

We know that school is the best place to learn. By attending school every day your child will get the most out of their learning and improve their career and life options.

When your child is absent it is important you let the school know, including the reason why, on the day or the day before. This helps make sure we know where our students are and offer support for you and your family if needed.

If you are having trouble getting your child to school every day or on time, please talk to our school staff so we can work together, because every day counts.

Missing a day here or there may not seem like much, but absences add up and can negatively impact your child's learning and wellbeing. When your child misses one day per fortnight, that's 4 weeks of missed learning in one year. Over an entire school journey this adds up to 1 year of lost learning.

Our CAPA Music lessons have been progressing extremely well over Term 1. Students from Kindergarten through Year 6 have learned some of the elements of music including dynamics, pitch and rhythm. We have combined musical theory with practice, exploring sounds with untuned instruments such as drums, triangles, maracas, tambourines and claves (clapping sticks) and also with our brand new class set of wonderful ukuleles. Singing has also been a big part of our music program. Locations have included the Music Room, the rear playground behind our Library, and even a few serenades outside the Principal's office. Students are learning about the importance of music in our daily lives. It involves maths, science, English, history and fine motor skills. Class 5/6S are building a Spotify playlist with parents and carers sharing favourite songs from a range of genres, as part of music appreciation. We have over an hour of music so far. Next steps will involve using glockenspiels and djembe drums. Many thanks to Mrs Squires for her support of musical education at our wonderful school.
