NAPLAN

Each year the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is sat by students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. Students will participate in tests for writing, reading conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

NAPLAN 2025 will take place from Wednesday 12 March to Monday 24 March. NAPLAN is just one part of our school's learning assessment program. The tests assess literacy and numeracy skills your child is already learning at school, so the best preparation is their everyday classroom learning. Our school will also undertake activities to help students become familiar with the types of questions and tools available in the online tests.

All Family/Sibling orders must be placed by 11pm the day before photo day.

Please note - A late/processing fee will apply for orders received 1 week after photo day.

Entries are again open for the Operation Art entries for the 2026 exhibition.

All students are invited to participate by submitting an artwork to Mrs Tomlinson by Monday May 12th 2025.

Artworks must be:

- · Labelled on the back in pencil with the student's name and school.
- · Between A4 and A2 in size.
- · Up to 5mm deep.
- · Must have a positive and encouraging message.


Last year, one of our students was selected for the Hospital 50, meaning her artwork will be permanently displayed at Westmead Children's Hospital. Valley View PS has great artistic talent, and we are excited to see what you can come up with!

Entries will be put up for the staff to do a blind vote to select 3 artworks which will represent our school. These students will then be given an Artwork Release Form to complete and return. Late entries will not be included due to the tight turn around after voting.

Why participate in Operation Art?

- · All student artworks are framed and exhibited in a NSW gallery.
- · More than 10,000 visitors from across the state view the exhibitions.
- · At least 120 works are selected for further exhibition opportunities.
- · 50 works are given to the Children's Hospital at Westmead.
- · Students discover purpose in artmaking by creating art to help children in hospital.
- · You can start your own gallery at school when the framed works are returned.
- · All students are recognised with printed certificates, invitations and catalogues.

So have a go at creating your masterpiece in pencil, crayon, paint or collage and bring it in to school before May 12th.
