

Stage 1 - Living Worlds (Science)

This webinar supports Stage 1 Living World with a focus on features of living things and their environment. Students will understand some of the iconic animals in their local area and how we can improve a local environment to encourage living things to thrive. Students will also be able to consider habitat in their backyard and understand how to safely find minibeasts in their garden.

Learning Intentions: We are

- · learning what "biodiversity" means
- learning about native animals in our local area
- learning how to safely investigate natural habitats
- learning how to care for our native animals

Success Criteria:

- We can describe what biodiversity means
- We can describe different native animals in our local area
- We can describe some things that make a habitat "healthy" for animals
- We have identified a habitat in our backyard (natural or human made)


Confusing Cans **Activity Card**

"How do we know which is the baked bean can?" asks Cosmic, "I don't want cat food or soup on toast!"




Make Your Own Happiness - Activity Instructions








All About Piet Mondrian (1872 - 1944)

Piet Mondrian was born in the Netherlands in 1872. His father and uncle were both artists so he was introduced to art at a very young age.


Mondrian's first job was as a teacher but he enjoyed painting at the same time.

His first paintings were called landscapes', which means that he painted things he could see in the countryside around where he lived.

Composition No. III by Piet Mondrian


All About Piet Mondrian (1872 - 1944)

Over time Mondrian became interested in abstract art. Abstract art doesn't show pictures of things but uses colours, lines and shapes to express how the artist is feeling.

Jogging on the Spot

Jog from one point to another and try your best to keep the same pace.








Plank

Hold your body in the plank position for as long as you can. Take a rest when you need to.


You can put your knees on the floor to make the move easier.



Leg Raises

Lie on your back and slowly raise one leg. Lower your leg slowly back down to the floor.

Repeat with the other leg.



Ladder Run

One at a time, jog up the ladder, placing both feet into each space as you go.


To make it more challenging, you could step outside the ladder and back in at each space.

Try to keep your toes pointed and your legs straight.



Press-Ups

You can put your knees on the floor to make the move easier.



Burpees

Try to maintain the same pace completing burpees. Try to keep your toes pointed and your legs straight.

What is a burpee?

Standing with your feet at shoulder width apart, bend from the knees and place both palms on the floor. Place your right foot back and then your left foot so that you are in a plank position. Bring your right leg and then left leg back into squat position and jump. Repeat.



High Knees

Raise each knee in front of you, one at a time, as high as you can.

To make this more challenging, try to do this quicker.



Step-Ups

Carefully, step on and off the bench, one foot at a time.

Design Your Dream Car - Activity Instructions

In this activity, you are going to design your very own dream car. Think big, dream out of the box and send in your wild ideas for a chance to win some great prizes. We've included all the instructions for the Toyota Dream Car Art Contest at the end.



REMEMBER:

- No idea is a bad idea sometimes it's the little ideas that open the way to big dreams!
- Don't worry about what's possible; just focus on what you'd like to see. Some amazing ideas are born from dreams!

Part A: Movement

Step 1. Do you think we will still be driving on roads in the future? What if you want to take your car over difficult terrains, like sand, mountains or the ocean? Does a car even need to have four wheels or any wheels at all?

Take some inspiration from animals in the natural world. Imagine a car with spider legs, a car that hops like a kangaroo, a slithering snake type car or a car that flies in any kind of way. You might like to list your ideas here:

Part B: Sustainable Power


Step 1 (optional). Watch this report on the World Solar Challenge.

Step 2. Petrol, gas and diesel are non-renewable resources, which means that they will eventually run out and we won't have any more of them left on planet Earth. Yet almost all cars currently use these as a source of fuel.

Car manufacturers are already considering alternative energy sources, but we're sure you could be even more creative.

Think about some things that go into your bin. What about a car powered by banana peels, or cat litter? Remember that years ago, carriages were pulled by horses and sailboats didn't have motors. What about a pedal-powered car, or a massive wind-up propellor?

Step 3. Think about what waste products your dream car's fuel might produce. Fossil fuels (like petrol) produce carbon dioxide emissions, which pollute the air. A solar-powered car has no emissions. A banana-powered car might produce compost, and horses produce manure - both of which are great for the garden! Maybe your car could produce even more interesting 'waste', like music or somehow turning rubbish into new electronic devices as it drives.

Step 4. Grab a new piece of paper and fold it in half twice so that you have four rectangular spaces.

Step 5. Sketch a draft of four cars that are powered in different ways. These designs don't have to be perfect or very detailed, they're just to explore your ideas. Make sure to explain your design using labels.

Part C: Sustainable Materials

Step 1 (optional). Read this factsheet on natural resources.

Step 2. There are benefits to using some materials over others in our designs, and we need to consider cost and sustainability. We also have to consider the physical properties of the materials, which might make them unsuitable for our purpose. Good designers think about all these things when figuring out how their ideas might work.

Make a list of materials you might use to build your dream car. Consider and evaluate the benefits and possible challenges of using these materials in your final design.
