





The Very Hungry Caterpillar.





In the light of the moon a little egg lay on a leaf.




On Monday he ate through one apple. But he was still hungry.

That night he had stomach-ache!






<u>Slide 10</u> - How many different items of food did the caterpillar eat on Saturday? What different shapes can you see looking at the foods? What day of the week will it be next?


Capacity is the amount that a container will hold.

FENCING


How did the athlete show respect in this scenario?

Maddison Elliott was only 13 years old when she won a gold medal at the 2012 London Paralympics for her part in the 4×100 m freestyle relay.







